The other team won with six goals to our one, but that one goal was down to me!



The Beatles were a famous band. They made music between 1962 and 1970. They were made up of four members. All four were born in Liverpool. Liverpool is in England.

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

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



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ENGAGING TEXTS TN EACH LEVEL








- Each level has two workbooks containing 15 weeks of texts each (four texts per week). Part A is a physical workbook and Part B is online.
