This unit focuses on the graphemes 'g', 'ge', 'gi'
and 'gy' to represent a sound (phoneme). This
unit also includes two common, high frequency
words, 'near' and 'between'.

# **Teaching Points**

- Identify the phoneme and how it is represented.
- Discuss how the letter 'g' can make hard and soft sounds. It usually makes a hard sound when followed by 'a', 'o' or 'u' and usually makes a soft sound when followed by 'e', 'i' or 'y'.
- Sort the list words to the graphemes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.

#### **Rules**

- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- (Note: in changeable and damageable the 'e' is retained to keep the soft 'g' sound.)



# **Unit Focus**

- This unit focuses on words that have silent letters.
- This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'horse' and 'disc'.

# **Teaching Points**

- Identify the silent letter in each word.
- Identify any other difficult parts of each word.
- Brainstorm to list the other words with silent letters and sort them into groups, along with the list words.

## Rules

- Note: The 'e' is retained when the suffix beginning with a vowel is added to keep the soft 'g' sound.
- Rule: To make words ending with 'ss' plural, 'es' is added.
- Rule: When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- Rule: To many words ending with 'f' or 'fe', change the 'f' to 'v' before adding the suffix.



This unit focuses on the graphemes 'ie', and 'ei',' to represent a sound (phoneme). This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'biscuit' and 'address'.

# **Teaching Points**

- Identify the phoneme and how it is represented.
- Discuss that when the sound is a long 'e', 'i'
  usually comes before 'e', except after 'c'. Identify
  the list words seize, weird, and caffeine which do
  not follow this rule.
- Sort the list words according to the graphemes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.

## Rules

- To many words ending with 'f' or 'fe', change the 'f' to 'v' before adding the suffix.
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- Double the consonant to keep the preceding vowel sound short.
- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.

# **Unit Focus**

- This unit focuses on the graphemes 'ay', 'ey', 'ai', 'a', 'eigh', 'aigh', and 'ei' to represent a sound (phoneme).
- This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'morning' and 'might'.

# **Teaching Points**

- Identify the phoneme and how it is represented.
- Identify any difficult parts of words.
- Sort the list words according to the graphemes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.

#### **Rules**

- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.
- To make the plural of words ending with a 'y'
  after a consonant, change the 'y' to 'i' and add
  'es'.
- The 'y' is retained when adding 'ing' to avoid 'ii' being written. (two exceptions are taxiing and skiing.)
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.





- Identify the three different sounds the grapheme 'ch' makes. Colour code the words with the same sound.
- Identify any other difficult parts of words.

# **Rules**

# **Teaching Points**

- Discuss the meaning of each suffix.
- Identify the base word for each list word where appropriate.
- Identify any smaller words that make up each word.
- Sort the list words according to the prefixes. (Brainstorm to add to each list.)

#### **Rules**

- When a word ends with a single 'I', double the 'I' when a suffix beginning with a vowel is added.
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- To make the plural of words ending with 'y' after a consonant, change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'es'.
- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.
   The 'y' is retained when adding 'ing' to avoid 'ii'.

- At the open-air musical festival the police ordered the removal of all the campers to the next field as the traffic signal system was not working due to an electrical fault in an overhead cable at our campsite.
- After their government had to abolish taxes, I could see the severe hardship suffered by the poor people. They had no running water, no drainage system and not enough food to nourish them so their only hope was the arrival of foreign aid.
