Rules


- Double the consonant to keep the preceding vowel sound short.
- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- With words ending in 'our' and 'ous', drop the 'u' before adding the suffixes 'ous', 'ious' or 'ity'.

Rules

- Double the consonant to keep the preceding vowel sound short.
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- To make the plural of words ending with 'y' after a consonant, change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'es'.
- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.

- To many words ending with 'Y' or 'fe', change the 'Y' to 'V' before adding the suffix.
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- To make the plural of words ending with 'y' after a consonant, change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'es'.
- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.

Unit Focus

- This unit focuses on words that are both **singular and plural nouns**. This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'carry' and 'surprised'.

Teaching Points

- Revise what is meant by singular and plural nouns and give examples of each. Discuss how the list words remain the same whether they are singular or plural.
- Identify any difficult parts of words.
- Brainstorm to list other singular and plural nouns.

Rules

- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.
- To make the plural of words ending with a 'y' after a consonant, change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'es'.
- The 'y' is retained when adding 'ing' to avoid 'ii' being written. (Two exceptions are taxiing and skiing.)
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.

Dictation

- There was a **series** of accidents in our house this week, starting with Mum, who burnt her ear while using the curling **tongs**. Dad cut through the telephone cable while cutting the hedge with the garden **shears**, Tom twisted his ankle when he was doing **athletics**, Bob sat down on top of his **spectacles**, I cut my hand with **scissors** while opening a parcel and Sandy had to get **tweezers** to extract a splinter from her hand.
- I was not **surprised** that we hadn't caught any fish so we just went for a swim in the river. Teaching Points

- Identify the words that have a long 'e' sound (magazine, trampoline, quarantine) and those that have a short 'e' sound.
- Discuss any difficult parts of words.
- Sort the list words according to the graphemes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.

Rules

- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix. (The 'e' is retained in serviceable etc to keep the soft 'c' sound.)
- To make many words ending with 'o' plural, 'es' or 's' is acceptable.
- When adding 'ly' to most words ending with 'ie', change the 'e' to 'y'.
- The 'y' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added. The 'y' is retained when adding 'ing' to avoid 'ii' being written (two exceptions are taxiing and skiing).
- Add 'k' to words ending with 'ic', before adding the suffixes 'y', 'ed', 'er', and 'ing'.




